

As a result of this move, all borough issues (building permits, zoning issues, trash/recycling issues, yard sale permits, parking tickets, etc.) will now be handled on the second floor. All water/sewer issues will be handled on the first floor just as they have been in the past. Follow the signs in the lobby to access the second floor. An elevator is available for your convenience.

When calling the Municipal Offices, if you know your party's extension number, you may dial it and be connected directly to their office... Or, you will be prompted to select #1 for the Borough Office or #3 for the Municipal Authority Office.

one is from The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection in the amount of \$76,103.00 to be used for the Borough's recycling program. These moneys will be used to purchase a leaf blower and tractor to haul it for leaf and limb collection at our parks, and also additional recycling containers. Secondly, Red Lion Borough received a grant from Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the continuation of the Red Lion Mile Rail Trail to connect to The Ma & Pa Greenway which runs to Locust Street. This grant, in the amount of \$387,600, will be used for design, permitting and construction of an asphalt surface that is expected to be started in 2017.

FROM THE ZONING & CODES ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, DAN SHAW:

By now, the grass has quit growing, and our thoughts are turning toward cold, snow-filled days. Here is some important ordinance information to remember for the fall and winter months.

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL: The owner, occupant, or tenant must remove or treat all snow, ice or sleet to a width of 36" from any sidewalk within 12 hours after the snow stops or the ice forms. If the snow stops or ice forms after 6 PM, it must be removed or treated by 6 PM the following day. It is also unlawful to place any snow or ice into a public street or alley.

GARBAGE COLLECTION: Do not place garbage at the point of collection in excess of 12 hours before your collection day, which is on Friday for all residential customers. Refuse being stored for collection must be placed in a container which shall not permit blowing or scattering by wind and shall be rodent-proof, insect-proof, and watertight.



NUISANCE VEHICLES: The outdoor storage of any motor vehicle that is without a valid inspection certificate or valid registration displayed for a period in excess of 30 days is considered to be a nuisance and must be removed or stored in a fully enclosed structure.

SNOW EMERGENCIES: In the event of a severe winter storm, the Mayor will declare a snow emergency that will be announced on local radio and television stations and on our website. You shall not park a motor vehicle or allow a vehicle to remain parked on all of Main Street, High Street or Broadway after a snow emergency is declared. Fines start at \$75.00 and may be assessed every eight hours.



TENANT REGISTRATION: Landlords must register all new tenants over the age of 18 within 30 days of occupancy of a residential rental unit.



TENANT COMPLAINTS: Red Lion Borough has a housing maintenance and occupancy code which deals with the maintenance of residential dwellings. If you have a complaint about your rental unit, forms are available at the borough office to report the problems.

HOUSING: No owner or occupant shall install, operate, or use an unvented space heater employing a flame. This would include unvented portable gas and kerosene heaters.

TREE TRIMMING: To avoid damage to borough equipment, personal vehicles and for the safety of everyone, trees must be kept trimmed to a height of 14' above and along the edge of the roadway and 9' above sidewalks.

The Pennsylvania State Police would like to remind residents that if you “See Something, Send Something”. A smart phone app produced for the State Police allows citizens to report suspicious activity via their smart phones by submitting photographs and other information to the Pennsylvania Criminal Intelligence Center (PaCIC). The app is designed to allow citizens to report suspicious activity that may be linked to terrorism, namely suspicious behavior and situations. The application, “See Something Send Something”, which is available at no cost for iPhone and Android phone users, also includes information on what to look for and when to report suspicious activity, along with how to receive important alerts. Citizens and police working hand-in-hand have proven to be a key ingredient in solving crimes and keeping neighborhoods safe. It just takes one tip to crack an important case or prevent a crime that’s about to take place.

In addition to the new mobile app, people can call the toll-free State Police Terrorism Tip Line at 1-888-292-1919 or email tips@pa.gov to report suspicious individuals or activity. “A dramatic melt-off of Arctic sea ice due to climate change is hitting closer to home than millions of Americans might think – triggering a domino effect leading to increased odds of severe winter weather outbreaks in the Northern Hemisphere’s middle latitudes, according to new research.”



You might find this to be a strange beginning to our fall article, and we can agree or disagree with this analysis of the research. With that said, severe winter conditions have a direct impact on your Emergency Services. For example, during the most recent January 2016 snowstorm, we had staff working 72 hours straight as some could not navigate the roads to get to the station or home from the station. While we responded on all calls, a response to you during an Emergency could be measured by the hour rather than minutes. After careful consideration as to how we can provide a more effective and safe response, we decided to purchase and add to our fleet a 2016 4x4 Ford Ambulance. In the past, we have been reluctant to purchase a 4x4 ambulance due to the extra cost (\$204,000); however, we feel a huge responsibility to our residents for a timely response regardless of

the weather, and also a commitment to safety for our team of providers.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING:

Pennsylvania's "Covered Device Recycling Act" (Act 108) prohibits the acceptance of certain electronic devices at all Pennsylvania solid waste disposal facilities and therefore prohibits residents from placing them at the curb for waste pick-up. Our waste hauler is NOT permitted to pick these items up at the curb.

Red Lion Borough does NOT accept these electronics at our Public Works Facility; however, the York County Solid Waste Authority launched a new Residential Electronics Recycling Program April 5, 2016. *Please note that this program is only guaranteed through December 29, 2016!* Negotiations for a 2017 program remain to be determined. The program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and will now be conducted Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 3:00 PM to 6:30 PM every week at the Authority's Yard Waste Site located off of Flour Mill Road in Manchester Township. Saturday events will no longer be conducted at the Yard Waste Site. For more information on this program, call the York County Solid Waste Authority at 717-845-1066, or visit their website, www.ycswa.com.



The Authority's new e-scrap management contract is with electronics recycling vendor ECOvanta and extends only to December 31, 2016. The Authority is pursuing program alternatives for 2017. Act 108 bans both the disposal and collection of certain electronic "covered devices". Electronics currently banned from hauler collection and disposal in PA waste disposal facilities include: *televisions, desktop and laptop computers, computer monitors and computer peripherals* (anything that connects to a computer such as a mouse, keyboard, printer, etc.). Material accepted in the program includes these electronic "covered devices" as well as other electronic recyclables including cell phones, vacuum cleaners, alarm clocks, irons and coffee makers or anything with a plug that does not contain Freons. Examples of Freon-containing items include refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers.

Act 108 needs to change. PLEASE voice your concerns by contacting the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection at 717-787-7382 and your state legislative representatives.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE:

The York County Solid Waste Authority conducts their FREE Household Hazardous Waste once a year on the first Saturday of every May from 9 AM – 1 PM. Safely manage household hazardous waste by bringing it to this free household hazardous waste collection program. Household hazardous waste includes any products from the home which are corrosive (drain cleaners or bleach), flammable (gasoline), reactive (chemistry kits) or toxic (pesticides).



They also offer "At Your Door Special Collection Service" available to ALL York County residents. Residents may schedule two pick-ups per home, per calendar year and can request up to two "kit bags" per pick-up to fill with accepted household hazardous products. Bags measure 30" wide x 40" high. The pick-up service requires a \$15 co-pay for each service call. To schedule a pickup, call 800-449-7587 Monday-Friday from 8AM to 8PM. Plastic kit bags, an instruction sheet, cable ties, a survey card, labels for unlabeled containers and a payment envelope (payment may be made by check or money order) will be sent via the U.S. Postal Service prior to the scheduled pick-up date. The maximum quantity of waste to be collected is limited to what will fit in the bag(s). In addition to the bag(s), residents may place up to eight fluorescent tubes per bag out for pick-up. Fluorescent tubes should be placed outside and next to the bag(s).

CHRISTMAS TREES

If you miss the Red Lion Borough curbside Christmas tree collection, the York County Solid Waste Authority will be accepting them December 26 through January 31 at their Yard Waste Transfer Facility.

An Important Message about Stormwater from Red Lion Borough and Red Lion Municipal Authority:

The following information was taken from www.allianceforthebay.org. The Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay brings together individuals, organizations, businesses and governments to find collaborative solutions, to build a strong commitment to stewardship, and to deliver innovative broadly-supported programs that benefit the land, waters and residents of the Chesapeake Bay area.

Stormwater runoff is often referred to as the major contributor to water quality degradation in the Chesapeake Bay Watershed and many other nearby regions. Where ever rain falls, there is stormwater.

Stormwater carries sediment, nutrients from lawns, waste from farms and pets, oil and litter from streets, and other contaminants into streams or storm drains. Most homeowners can take positive steps right in their own yards. The Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay recognizes that homeowners play a crucial role in limiting water pollution.

“When you add up the combined efforts of thousands of individual homeowners, the cumulative improvement on stormwater runoff and water quality can be quite substantial,” says Al Todd, Executive Director of the Alliance, “But it can be hard to find the right information to get started. The Alliance has pulled this information together in an easy to use reference”.

Did You Know...

- **Rain Gardens** allow more rain to soak into the ground. Compared to a conventional lawn, rain gardens allow for 30% more rain to soak into the ground.



- A **Rain Barrel** will save about 1,300 gallons of water during the peak summer months. During an average summer rain shower (1 inch of rain) your roof may drain over 600 gallons of water across the shingles, into the gutters and down through the downspouts. This stormwater can be collected by diverting your downspouts into rain barrels. Red Lion Municipal Authority frequently has rain barrels made out of recycled materials available for sale. Call them at 717-244-3475 to check on availability.
- **One mature tree** can absorb nearly 1,400 gallons of polluted runoff a year. This runoff essentially “rinses off” the landscapes where it falls and can carry pollution that impacts stream quality and can increase flooding. In nature, water is usually absorbed into soil, soaked up by plants, and cleaned before entering waterways or recharging groundwater.
- **Using native plants** that are adapted to the local conditions requires less fertilizer and pesticides. Bayscaping is the practice of modifying the visible features of an area of land in a way that incorporates environmentally sensitive design, low impact development, non-invasive native plants, and/or integrated pest management. The purpose is to create a diverse landscape that helps to protect clean air and water and support wildlife.
- **Disconnecting the downspout** from the storm drain system and redirecting it to the lawn, a garden, or a rain barrel can reduce runoff volume and keep pollutants out of our waters. If your gutter system flows directly into the ground or across paved surfaces, a downspout disconnection is one of the cheapest and easiest stormwater management practices that you can implement at your home.

Red Lion Borough and Red Lion Municipal Authority are preventing stormwater pollution through a stormwater management program. This program addresses stormwater pollution from construction, illegal dumping to the storm sewer system, pollution prevention and good housekeeping practices in municipal operations. We will also continue to educate the community and get everyone involved in making sure the only thing that stormwater contributes to our water is...water! Branch & Limb Collections:

Fall 2016: October 3 - 7

Spring 2017: May 1 - 5

Branches and limbs should be placed at your garbage collection site. The chipper/shredder will make a daily circuit around the Borough to pick them up. Limbs may be up to 6" in diameter and 4' to 6' in length. **Do not bundle.** Yard waste such as ornamental grass, garden residue, etc., will not be picked up. If you have material to be picked up and it has not been collected by Thursday during the collection week, please call the Borough Office at 717-244-3475. The Borough reserves the right to refuse items that do not meet the requirements and is not responsible for cleanup.



Fall Leaf Collection:

Oct. 10 - Dec. 2

Leaf collection for 2016 will begin on Monday, October 10 and will continue through Friday, December 2. Place leaves at the curb. They will not be picked up if they are placed elsewhere. Do not mix any other items with the leaves. The pickup schedule is variable depending on weather conditions. We will get to your leaves as soon as we can. We appreciate your understanding that this schedule must be flexible. There will be no collection on Borough holidays. Leaves in plastic trash bags will not be picked up.



DO NOT place your leaves at the curb before our collection begins. Doing this will clog our storm drains, and they **MUST** remain clear of debris.

IMPORTANT NOTE: How to Manage Yard/Wood Waste: We cannot accept yard waste items at our Public Works Facility. One option is to compost these items at home. OR you can take items such as branches, limbs, leaves, garden residue, ornamental grass, shrubbery, tree trimmings, tree stumps (stumps must not exceed 12 inches in diameter) and similar matter (but does not include grass clippings) to the York County Solid Waste Authority's Resource Recovery Center. This yard waste is then diverted to the Authority's Yard Waste Transfer Facility on Blackbridge Rd. in Manchester Township. NOTE: Before doing this, visit their website at www.ycswa.com, or call them at 717-845-1066, for requirements and restrictions you will need to be aware of.



Christmas Tree Collection:

January 3 - 20, 2017

The Borough will pick up discarded Christmas trees beginning Tuesday, January 3 through Friday, January 20. Trees should be placed at your usual trash pickup site and **MUST NOT** be in a bag. All decorations and tinsel must be removed.

Rent-A-Kid Program

Hey Senior Citizens... HELP IS AVAILABLE WITH CHORES!

Check out the York County Area Agency on Aging's Rent-A-Kid Program. This wonderful program provides an opportunity for middle and high school students, in grades 7 through 12, to assist older adults in completing routine light-duty household chores, yard work, mowing lawns and shoveling snow. The goal of the program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between older adults and youth.

Adults, age 60 and older, in need of assistance with chores can call the Rent-A-Kid coordinator who will provide names and phone numbers for youth in their area. It is the responsibility of the older adult to contact the youth and discuss the job to be done, when it is to be done, the rate of pay for the job, and any other arrangements that need to be made.

Recommended pay rate is \$5 per hour. However, depending on the type of work and the ability of the older adult to pay, the youth may negotiate a more satisfactory rate of pay.

Youth interested in the Rent-A-Kid program should contact their school guidance counselor or call the Coordinator at YCAA for an application at 717-771-9103. Water Improvements



For many years, we've brought you the fresh, cool taste of safe, clean drinking water. In 1988, a new treatment plant was constructed at Cabin Creek, replacing the 1925 plant at the same location.

All raw water passes through the treatment plant for purification. The treatment process consists of aeration, oxidation, coagulation, clarification, filtration, corrosion control, disinfection and fluoridation. Upon completion of the treatment process, the purified water is pumped into the distribution system.

Red Lion Municipal Authority is investing in your future health by making additional improvements. What does this mean to you? Better taste. Better quality. Better service.

To improve water quality, we have constructed a new Water Treatment Plant (WTP) at Cabin Creek in Windsor Township that

went online April 7, 2015. This is the same location as the earlier water treatment plants. With this new construction, the addition of a new clearwell gives the Authority an additional potable water capacity of approximately 500,000 gallons. With the new WTP, sodium hypochlorite is being used as a disinfection instead of gaseous chlorine. In the near future, the Authority will be switching to chloramination as a disinfection, which was used years ago. All customers will be notified when this occurs.

Also, demolition has begun at the old WTP for the conversion to a waste water treatment plant. This conversion will process the material that occurs during the filter washes or blowdowns during the water treatment process.

Water Project 2016

As announced in the spring newsletter, our current water main and water service line project is on E. Broadway from the square to Redco Ave. and on East Ave. from E. Broadway to S. Main St.

This project consists of water main replacement and water service line replacement to curb stops. The water main being replaced was installed in 1893 and is 3" and 4" cast iron piping. It is being replaced with 8" ductile iron pipe. Barrasso Excavating, Inc. was awarded the bid to complete this project that began in July. 
- Every Tuesday, at both 10:15 & 11:15, we offer Preschool Literacy Class for those ages 3 to 5.

Carbon Monoxide Safety

Often called the silent killer, carbon monoxide is an invisible, odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel can be sources of carbon monoxide.

- CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards. For the best protection, interconnect all CO alarms throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.
 - Follow the manufacturer's instructions for placement and mounting height.
 - Choose a CO alarm that has the label of a recognized testing laboratory.
 - Call your local fire department's non-emergency number to find out what number to call if the CO alarm sounds.
 - Test CO alarms at least once a month; replace them according to the manufacturer's instructions.
 - If the audible trouble signal sounds, check for low batteries. If the battery is low, replace it. If it still sounds, call the fire department.
- 
- If the CO alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location outdoors or by an open window or door. Make sure everyone inside the home is accounted for. Call for help from a fresh air location and stay there until emergency personnel.
 - If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Do not run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not covered with snow.
 - During and after a snowstorm, make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove, and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.
 - A generator should be used in a well-ventilated location outdoors away from windows, doors and vent openings.
 - Gas or charcoal grills can produce CO — only use outside.

Clothes Dryer Safety

Doing laundry is most likely part of your every day routine. But did you know how important taking care of your clothes dryer is to the safety of your home? With a few simple safety tips you can help prevent a clothes dryer fire.

- Have your dryer installed and serviced by a professional.
- Do not use the dryer without a lint filter.
- Make sure you clean the lint filter before or after each load of laundry. Remove lint that has collected around the drum.
- Rigid or flexible metal venting material should be used to sustain proper air flow and drying time.
- Make sure the air exhaust vent pipe is not restricted and the outdoor vent flap will open when the dryer is operating. Once a year, or more often if you notice that it is taking longer than normal for your clothes to dry, clean lint out of the vent pipe or have a dryer lint removal service do it for you.
- Keep dryers in good working order. Gas dryers should be inspected by a professional to make sure that the gas line and connection are intact and free of leaks.
- Make sure the right plug and outlet are used and that the machine is connected properly.
- Follow the manufacturer's operating instructions and don't overload your dryer.
- Turn the dryer off if you leave home or when you go to bed.



and Don't Forget...

- Dryers should be properly grounded.
- Check the outdoor vent flap to make sure it is not covered by snow.
- Keep the area around your dryer clear of all things that can burn, like boxes, cleaning supplies and clothing, etc.
- Clothes that have come in contact with flammable substances, like gasoline, paint thinner, or similar solvents should be laid outside to dry, then can be washed and dried as usual.




