1. The meeting was called to order @ 7:00p.m. Pastor Monte Jones from Dove Community Cell Church opened with a prayer. All present participated in the pledge to the flag.
2. Mrs. Frutiger made a motion to accept the July 11, 2011 meeting minutes with the following correction: **under “Parks and Recreation”, Item 4, “the July 4th car show made \$1,400 profit”,** (not \$140 as stated). Mr. Smith seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
3. **VISITORS AND PUBLIC COMMENTS**
 - **Kenneth Duncan from 200 North Main Street** addressed Council about a commercial truck that has been parking in front of his property. He questioned the Borough Ordinance which restricts this; however, there is no height restriction noted in the Ordinance, and the vehicle in question is only as wide as a pick-up truck. Per the Ordinance, vehicles no larger than a “pick-up truck” are allowed on residential streets, and in this case a “dual-wheel” pick-up is still a pick-up. Council said the Ordinance would have to be amended in order to address this, and then vehicles on all Borough streets would have to comply. This issue will be looked into further.
 - **Clarence Schmuck from 118 South Main Street** addressed Council with a concern that his neighbor shoots target practice with a bow & arrow in the Borough. He does not want to confront the neighbor about this because he feels threatened by him, especially with the weapon. At this time, there is no Ordinance against this in town. Officer Greenly reassured Mr. Schmuck that he will look into the matter and make sure that he is safe.
4. **PUBLIC SAFETY**—Mrs. Frutiger:
 - **Fire Company Report**—Mrs. Frutiger attended a recent Fire Company meeting, where the issue of the siren was discussed. The Fire Company would like to schedule a meeting with Council to decide one way or the other what will be done about the siren. Fire representatives don’t believe that Council respects the job they do. Mrs. Frutiger believes this meeting is vital in getting these issues resolved. The meeting will be scheduled very soon. Julie Yahnke reported other Fire Company issues:
 - **Knox Boxes**—Fire Company does not need their contact numbers on the list for the boxes, but they are requesting they be informed when any new boxes are installed anywhere. They would also like emergency contact numbers included on the list for the boxes so they know who to call in the event of an emergency at that particular business/location.
 - **Cookbooks** are still for sale

- They will have a stand at the Red Lion Street Fair
 - Ambulance report was distributed
 - EMC—Scott Kopp reported that one of their radios was stolen last month. A Police report was filed and it was turned into insurance for replacement. Scott is requesting that he & Craig Danley be allowed to keep their radios with them at all times because of their work schedules.
5. **POLICE REPORT**—Officer Greenly reported for July:
- Part I offenses—16
 - Part II offenses—26
 - Miscellaneous incidents—169
 - No accidents listed
 - Summary citations—4
 - Misdemeanor/felony arrests—10
 - No juvenile arrests
 - 803½ service hours
6. **MAYOR KOPP'S REMARKS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**—Mayor Kopp reported the Red Lion Men's Baseball team won another Susquehanna League championship. Council agreed to recognize the team depending on the outcome of the Colonial Tournament, Labor Day.
7. **ORDINANCES**—The following were before Council for adoption:
- Ordinance 2011-8-7—to prohibit parking on Martin Street during school hours (Monday-Friday, 7-4pm). Mr. Smith made a motion to adopt this Ordinance; Mrs. Frutiger seconded. Discussion was held. Mr. Henshaw does not think this will achieve the goal that the residents want. He feels the school kids will still go there to smoke and that there will still be a litter problem. A vote was taken; motion carried with 1 opposing (Mr. Henshaw).
 - Approval to advertise the Integrated Stormwater Ordinance, which is required by York County to be enacted by October. Mrs. Frutiger made a motion to approve the advertisement. Mrs. Snell seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
8. **PETITIONS**—none
9. **RESOLUTIONS**
- Resolution 2011-16—to set fees & requirements for permits, inspections & a degradation fee for street openings. This sets a \$25 permit fee, \$20 inspection fee, and a \$20/sq. ft. degradation fee for opening Borough streets paved within the last four (4) years. Mrs. Frutiger made a motion to adopt this Resolution. Mr. Smith seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
 - Resolution 2011-17—to sign ARLE grant paperwork for omitters at PennDot intersections. Mr. Smith made a motion to adopt this Resolution. Mr. Klindedinst seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
10. **AGREEMENTS**—A three-year agreement with York Area Regional Police Department, effective January 1, 2012 for 15 Police protection units. Mr. Shellenberger made a motion to sign the agreement; Mrs. Snell seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
11. **BIDS**—none
12. **ENGINEER'S REPORT**—Jeff Shue reported the following:
- Street work awarded to Fitz & Smith has begun
 - Box for stormwater improvements for Red Lion Mile continuation is almost complete
 - Fabie Subdivision Plan—meeting is scheduled between them & C.S. Davidson to discuss a re-design for Spruce Street. Jeff has concerns with some of their proposals, but would like Council's approval on the plan, contingent upon having Davidson's needs met. Mr. Smith made this motion; Mrs. Frutiger seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
 - Boxwood Elm Plan—Jeff has some concerns for the fire/emergency management services with the limited access to this development. Council may not see these plans for a month or so, but he wanted to bring it to Council's attention.
 - Streetscape final walk-through—scheduled for August 11th @ 9am

13. **SOLICITOR'S REPORT**—Mrs. Ehrhart will contact Sam about Vulcan Road property to try & get the issue with this resolved.
14. **PARKS AND RECREATION**—Mr. Klinedinst reported:
 - Fireworks issue—still dealing with the company & payment
 - Fall program sign-ups—baseball, softball, flag football, field hockey
15. **MUNICIPAL SERVICES**—no report
16. **PUBLIC WORKS**—Mr. Smith & Mrs. Price reported on the oversize loads coming through town & looking into diverting them another route; discussion on raising the masts @ intersections if necessary. Also, curb/sidewalk installation along Horace Mann Avenue is planned for 2013.
17. **PLANNING, ZONING AND REDEVELOPMENT**—no Planning Commission meeting in August
18. **ADMINISTRATION**—Mr. Shellenberger reported the deadline for Catherine Meyer Award nominations is September 12th. Of note, Mrs. Price did a recent budget comparison with the 2010 budget, and found revenue is light in Earned Income Tax and Real Estate Tax. Expenditures seem to be in line with last year.
19. **COMMUNICATION**—no Workshop meeting in September
20. **Manager's Comments**—Mrs. Price distributed report
21. Mr. Smith made a motion to approve the bills & statements; Mr. Shellenberger seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
22. Mr. Shellenberger made a motion to adjourn the meeting @ 8:17p.m. Motion carried; meeting adjourned.
