1. The meeting was called to order @ 7:00p.m. Vince Gomez from Dove Community Cell Church offered a prayer. Everyone present participated in the pledge to the flag.
2. With two small changes, Mr. Klinedinst made a motion to approve the March 11th, 2013 meeting minutes; Mr. Hughes seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
3. **VISITORS AND PUBLIC COMMENTS**
 - Council President Kelly Henshaw stated at their recent Work Session, Council created a committee that will meet with York Area Regional Police Department regarding the Police contract. The committee will consist of Walt Hughes, Christina Frutiger, Mayor Kopp and himself. Mr. Henshaw also stated it is not Council's wishes for Red Lion to start their own Police force. He opened the floor to public comment at this time.
 - Vince Caltagirone from Golden Crust Pizza stated he had heard Council is intending to drop the services of York Area Regional Police Department, and establish a Police Department in Red Lion Borough. He wants to know that his family and Red Lion residents are safe, and should Red Lion use State Police to patrol the borough, he fears their response time would be very slow. Council President Henshaw stated that discussion held with YARPD will be concerning their patrol hours, and he personally is not in favor of dropping YARPD, nor starting a police force in Red Lion.
 - Nevin Horne, Jr. stated he is concerned that Council had cut patrol hours of YARPD, and there was no public discussion to notify residents of what was being done. Mr. Horne had heard that a letter was sent to York Area Regional trying to get out of the contract, but he is wondering what Council's agenda actually is.
 - Joel Logel reported that his car was recently hit by a young driver while it was parked along Rt. 24. He said a York Area Regional officer responded within seven (7) minutes and they were very courteous and understanding with the young driver, who was uninjured, but very distraught.
 - Anna Heisler, who lives in the Edgewood Road neighborhood, was present to ask if and when there are plans to pave in that neighborhood, which is in great need of repair. Mrs. Price said she would get back to Mrs. Heisler regarding this.
4. **PUBLIC SAFETY**—Mrs. Frutiger:
 - **Fire Company Report**—Julie & Joe Yahnke reported the following:

- 14 calls this month, with 137 personnel responding
 - 2012 report was sent to Mrs. Price and distributed to Council
 - Snow removal was \$605 over budget for 2012; invoices totaled \$1,605 (\$420 for the front pad, \$1,185 for the back lot). Mr. Hughes made a motion to reimburse the \$605 to the Fire Company; Mr. Klinedinst seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.

 - **EMA Report**—Scott Kopp reported that on April 13th quarterly training will be conducted
5. **POLICE REPORT**—to come later this month
 6. **MAYOR KOPP'S REMARKS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**—Mayor Kopp reported:
 - He recently officiated his 12th wedding since taking office.
 - He and Scott Kopp had recently attended Exelon's annual dinner of local officials.
 - He and his wife helped serve breakfast with the Easter bunny at the Community building on Saturday, March 30th.

 12. **ENGINEER'S REPORT**—none
 13. **SOLICITOR'S REPORT**—none
 14. **PARKS AND RECREATION**—Mr. Klinedinst reported:
 - Junior Legion wishes to operate the concession stand for sporting events. Mr. Klinedinst made a motion that the Junior Legion pays \$650 to operate the concession stand this year; Mrs. Snell seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
 - Recreation Board will donate \$1,400 to put a tarp over the baseball bases on Horn Field. This is approximately half of the actual cost of the tarp. Mr. Klinedinst made a motion to approve this purchase; Mrs. Snell seconded. Motion carried with Mrs. Frutiger opposing.
 - Breakfast with the Easter bunny—114 adults & 77 children attended; \$448 was collected, along with a \$150 donation from Metro Bank, totaling \$598 collected. However, once costs were factored in, \$90 was lost on the event.
 15. **MUNICIPAL SERVICES**—Mr. Hughes reported:
 - The Municipal Authority agreed to waive the Borough's water & sewer bills for the Splash Park (and restrooms) until there is actual usage there.
 - Recent hydrant damage by a vehicle will be paid for by insurance
 - Borough may be named in a lawsuit (Municipal Authority is already named in it) regarding a traffic accident which happened New Year's Eve. It was on a state highway, so it's unknown how much liability the Borough will incur. Mr. Hughes would like to see a copy of the Police Report from the accident.
 16. **PUBLIC WORKS**—Mr. Klinedinst reported (in Mr. Smith's absence):
 - Horace Mann road work by William Henry—Mr. Klinedinst made a motion to waive the street cutting fee incurred by Mr. Henry; Mrs. Snell seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
 - 2013 street projects—Mr. Klinedinst made a motion to approve the list of streets to bid; Mrs. Frutiger seconded. All were in favor; motion carried. The bid opening will be May 8th.
 - Removal of the smokestack & upper level of the old incinerator building. Mr. Shellenberger made a motion to award the bid to the lowest bidder; Mrs. Snell seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
 17. **PLANNING, ZONING, AND REDEVELOPMENT**—Mrs. Snell reported:
 - PEDYC application approval for 501c3 status (non-profit)—this is for York Economic Alliance to establish an account for Redevelopment to accept donations for new Christmas

decorations. Mrs. Snell made a motion to approve the application; Mr. Klinedinst seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.

- Mrs. Snell made a motion to approve Code Administrators as an approved UCC inspector for residents to use; Mr. Klinedinst seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.

21. Mr. Shellenberger made a motion to approve bills & statements; Mrs. Frutiger seconded. All were in favor; motion carried.
