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



Backyard Composting Workshops

Electronics Recycling

In Pennsylvania certain electronics are restricted by law from being disposed of in the trash due to the toxic metals they contain. The Covered Device Recycling Act (CDRA), Act 108 of 2010, requires the following "covered devices" to be recycled in Pennsylvania:

- Computers
- Computer Peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer, etc.)
- Computer Monitors
- Televisions

YCSWA provides a FREE Electronics Recycling Program. All York County residents can bring electronics to our Small Load Drop-Off Area located at the York County

Resource Recovery Center on Blackbridge Rd. to be recycled at no cost. For more information about electronics recycling, visit https://www.ycswa.com/disposal-of-household-waste/electronics/

Curbside Recycling

Knowing what to put in your recycling bin is very important. If you put items into your recycling bin that do not belong there, the entire bin might be considered "contaminated". The contents of contaminated bins are collected and taken to our waste-to-energy facility instead of being recycled into a new product. Most municipalities offer curbside or drop-off recycling services. If you are confused about what should be deposited in the recycling bin, your first step is to contact your municipality for those details. Items accepted for recycling may vary depending on the type of recycling program and/or where you live. ZONING & CODES ENFORCEMENT

From the Desk of our Zoning & Codes Enforcement Officer, Dan Shaw:

QUALITY OF LIFE TICKETING PROGRAM

Red Lion Borough has implemented a Quality of Life Ticketing Program. This program is for certain property maintenance violations and is similar to the Red Lion Borough parking violation tickets. When a problem property is identified by a Red Lion Borough Code Official, a courtesy notice identifying the violation will be posted on the property. If the violation is not corrected within the time specified on the notice, a violation ticket will be issued and posted on the property or delivered to an adult resident of the property. Fines will start at \$25 for the first offense and will increase with each additional violation, up to \$300. Tickets are to be paid within ten (10) days of receipt in accordance with the instructions on the ticket. If not paid within those ten days, a citation will be issued through the district magistrate's office, which will include additional court costs. Some of the most common violations include:

- Nuisance vehicles
- Items not for outside storage
- Grass and weeds over 6"
- Accumulation of refuse

Please read and become familiar with the following important ordinance information for the spring and summer months:

TREE TRIMMING:

To avoid damage to borough equipment, personal vehicles and for the safety of everyone, trees must be kept trimmed to a height of 14 feet above and along the edge of the roadway and 9 feet above sidewalks.



GRASS AND WEEDS:

Grass and weeds shall not exceed six inches (6") in length. Do not forget grass and weeds in sidewalks and curbs.



Do not place garbage at the point of collection in excess of 12 hours before your collection day, which is Friday for all residential customers. Refuse being stored for collection must be placed in a container which shall not permit blowing or scattering by wind and shall be rodent-proof, insect-proof, and watertight.

ITEMS NOT FOR OUTDOOR USE:

The outdoor storage of lumber, scrap metal, construction materials, machinery components, equipment, appliances, furniture not designed and intended for exterior use, or any similar object which is not clearly intended for outdoor use is considered a nuisance and must be removed or stored indoors.



NUISANCE VEHICLES:

The outdoor storage of any motor vehicle that is without a valid inspection certificate or valid registration displayed for a period in excess of 30 days is considered to be a nuisance and must be removed or stored in a fully enclosed structure.

SEVENTY-TWO HOUR PARKING LIMIT:

No motor vehicle shall be allowed to remain parked on any borough highway, street or alley for a period longer than 72 consecutive hours without being moved. When calling to report a vehicle, please include the make, model, color and license plate information.

SWIMMING POOLS:

BEWARE of the swimming pools being sold as a portable kit at almost all retailers. If the pool is capable of holding 24 inches or more of water, you will need to obtain a zoning permit and a building permit. Typically, the zoning permit costs \$30, and the building permit will cost approximately \$150. The pool will also require a 4' high fence around it if the pool is less than 4' high. That low-priced pool now costs \$180 more than what you were planning to spend!!



BUILDING & ZONING PERMITS:

Most maintenance to residential properties does not require a building or zoning permit. Additions, structural changes or repairs, sheds, fences and walls will require a permit. Commercial properties typically require a building permit for almost all types of work. Contact the Borough Office for more information.

TENANT REGISTRATION:

Landlords must register all new tenants over the age of 18 within 30 days of occupancy of a rental unit.

TENANT COMPLAINTS:

Red Lion Borough has a housing maintenance and occupancy code which deals with the maintenance of residential dwellings. If you have a complaint about your rental unit, forms are available at the Borough Office to report the problems.

PENNSYLVANIA'S WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Pennsylvania's Weatherization Assistance Program increases energy efficiency in homes by reducing energy costs and increasing comfort while safeguarding health and safety.

This Federally funded program provides services to low-income (at or below 200% of the federal poverty level-see chart below) homeowners and renters. There is no cost to either the homeowner, landlord or tenant; however, landlord permission is required.

Some services that may be provided include attic and basement insulation, water heater and pipe insulation, window and door weather-stripping, caulking, broken glass replacement and glazing. Also, the heating system and water heater are tested for efficiency and safety. Inefficient or unsafe heating systems will be repaired or replaced. All work is done on an as needed basis.

LIHEAP eligible households may qualify for heating system tune-ups and/or air conditioning help.






RED LION AMPITHEATER

The Borough of Red Lion proposes to install a naturalized, $480\pm$ SF, amphitheater stage at its existing Fairmount Park. The park is the Borough's premier park and is well integrated within the community being adjacent to the public library and existing high school athletic facilities like the football field. The goal of the project would be to create a uniquely naturalized amphitheater space by integrating the new structure into a two-acre hillside covered with existing evergreen trees. The lower limbs of the tall pines and firs have been removed so visitors have views across the distant landscape while hearing the wind gently swaying the limbs above.

The addition of the amphitheater would further enhance the image of the park and provide a great venue for outdoor performances. The park has easy access to public utilities and existing parking that is efficiently shared with the neighboring users described above. Fairmount Park is located at a local highpoint from the main entrance off of Boundary Avenue. The upper half of the existing 12± acre park is organized around a large lawn area and includes a focal-point war memorial, pavilions, playground, walking loop and a popular splash pad. The south side of the property is more naturally wooded and slopes relatively steeply toward Fairview Street. This makes an ideal natural amphitheater space. At present this approximately 2-acre portion of the park is relatively unused. The existing slopes are covered with tall pines and fir trees



which would provide shade and a uniquely naturalized venue. The amphitheater would be nestled at the bottom of the hill to minimize impacts to the existing trees and picturesque view. Locating the amphitheater near Fairview Street would also provide convenient existing parking and access for bringing performance equipment to the site. A key component of the project will be designing ADA access from Fairview Street. A grant was received for this project and Red Lion ROARS matched the grant funding.






